# **DELUXE SELF INFLATING MAT USER GUIDE**

Congratulations on choosing a BlackWolf self inflating mat.

Below are instructions to help you use your BlackWolf self inflating mat and ensure it lasts a long time. When you get your mat home and inflate it for the first time it will take a while to inflate because your new mattress has been stored tightly rolled since production. Open the valve and let the mat self inflate for a while then overinflate with a few breaths or using the pumpsack (see other side for pumpsack instructions), close the valve and leave overnight.

### TO INFLATE

Open both valve caps to allow maximum air flow to be sucked into the mat (picture A). The longer you leave your mat like this the more it will inflate itself, it's a good idea to unroll your mat as soon as you arrive at camp and get your tent pitched to allow it to self inflate. It is OK to unroll your mat just before you want to go to bed but it will require more manual inflating using your lungs or the pumpsack.



To finish preparing your mat for sleeping install the orange cap in the 'INFLATE' position (picture B), this allows you to inflate the mat further with a few breaths or the pumpsack without air escaping (see page 2 for pumpsack instructions). The more air you add the firmer the mat will become, if you like a soft mattress just add enough air so that when you lie down your hip and shoulder are off the ground. Once you mat is inflated to your prefered firmness install the top cap.



### TO DEFLATE

Open both valve caps to release the air (picture A), turn the orange cap over and install it in the 'DEFLATE' position (picture C), this will allow you to push air out but stop air being sucked back into the mat. Fold the mat over a couple of times and kneel on it to push most of the air out of the mat, then unfold it and roll the mat to fit in the pumpsack.



## STORAGE RECOMENDATIONS

Store your mat unrolled with the valve open in a dry place with low humidity, under a bed is a good place. The foam in your mat will remember the shape it is kept in so by storing your mat unrolled and inflated it will self-inflate much faster when you unroll it at camp.

### CARE AND REPAIR

Be careful with your mat, it is made from durable fabrics but it can be punctured by sharp objects like thorns, sticks or stones. Puncturing is not covered by warranty.

If your mat does get a puncture it can be repaired with the included repair kit.

Clean your mat when it gets dirty with water and a soft bristled brush. If it is really dirty you can also use an outdoor gear washing product such as Grangers Fabsil Universal Cleaner, Nikwax Tech Wash or McNett Pro Cleaner, all available at camping stores.
